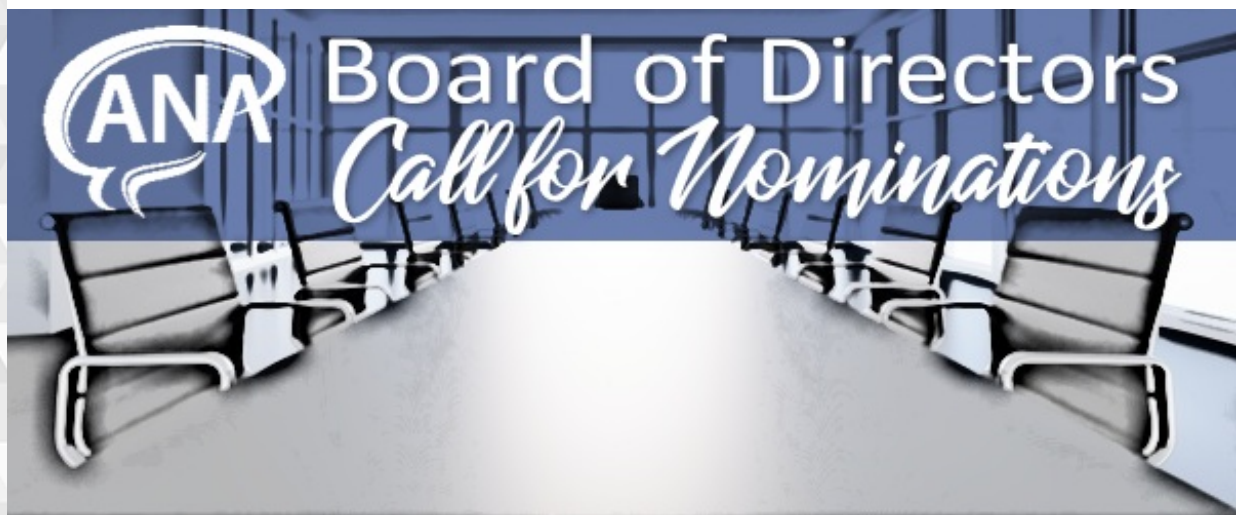
K-Awardees Have the Opportunity to Connect and Learn at ANA2023

The ANA-NINDS Career Development Symposium will be held September 8 – 9, 2023 in

Philadelphia in conjunction with ANA2023. This is an unparalleled opportunity to meet as a group and to connect on an individual basis with leaders in the neurology research community. The symposium is designed for clinician-scientists with NIH career development awards (KO8 and K23) and will include several lectures along with small group discussions with faculty and chairs.
