ANA2023 Awards and Recognition


From March 10 – April 7, 2023, the ANA will accept nominations for ANA Awards to be presented at ANA2023. It is important to recognize individuals making significant contributions and advances in discovery in the field of neurology. The ANA offers several awards, and you could nominate someone you know to receive one of the following awards:

- Raymond D. Adams Lectureship honors Dr. Raymond D. Adams, emeritus Bullard Professor of Neurology at Harvard Medical School, and emeritus Chief of Neurology Service at the Massachusetts General Hospital. An ANA member presents the lecture at the Annual Meeting.
- <u>F.E. Bennett Memorial Lectureship</u> is given to outstanding researchers and educators in neurology and is not limited to members of the ANA.
- <u>The Grass Foundation ANA Award in Neuroscience</u> honors outstanding young investigators doing research in basic or clinical neuroscience.
- George W. Jacoby Award is given triennially to a member of the ANA who has done some especially meritorious experimental work upon any neurologic or psychiatric subject. This award will be presented in 2023.
- <u>The Audrey Penn Lectureship Award</u> is provided to an ANA member who conducts outstanding research, program building, or educational scholarship to promote health equity on health care disparities.

- <u>Soriano Lectureship</u> is presented in honor of the Soriano's so they *would* always be linked to all of you, through a brilliant lecture delivered by an outstanding scientist.
- Wolfe Research Prize for Identifying New Causes or Novel Treatment of <u>Neuropathy</u> is designed to honor an outstanding investigator who has identified a new cause or treatment of neuropathy.
- <u>Derek Denny-Brown Young Neurological Scholar Award</u> is the ANA's highest and
 most prestigious award recognizing early to mid-career neurologists and
 neuroscientists who have made outstanding basic and clinical scientific
 advances toward the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and cure of neurological
 diseases.
- ANA Awards for Excellence recognize individuals who have made exceptional and important contributions to the field of neurology and neuroscience. Up to three individuals are recognized each year.
- <u>Distinguished Neurology Teacher Award</u> recognizes an individual for outstanding accomplishments in teaching neurology to residents and medical students.
- <u>ANA-Persyst IDEAS Professional Development Award</u> is granted to an individual
 who identifies as an underrepresented in medicine early career academic
 neurologist or neuroscientist and is an ANA member who specializes in the field
 of epilepsy.

ANA Offers CME Year-Round – Get credits anytime and anywhere!

The ANA offers CME credits year-round, and you can obtain credits anytime and anywhere. I recently sat down with Jen Hurley, CHCP, CPHQ, of the Goodwin Group to learn more about CME offered through the ANA. I feel it is important for our members to know the value their membership brings through educational programming, and not just that offered at the Annual Meeting. Did you know you can get CME for listening to an enlightening podcast? You don't even have to complete a quiz!

Jen Hurley is our resident CME expert and works to ensure the ANA offers the highest quality educational programming so our members can obtain CME credits when they need them. ANA offers members an opportunity to provide CME for educational offerings in your home institutions, regional symposia, and other meetings. If you do not have ready access to institutional CME, the ANA is an accredited provider of CME and may be able to help. Please contact <u>Jen Hurley</u> or <u>Nadine Goldberg</u> for a fee schedule for providing CME accreditation for programming.

Q: In what ways does the ANA offer CME to its members?

Jen: In so many new ways! The annual meeting has always been the flagship, and 2019 was a big year for the ANA's CME program. Under the leadership of Dr. Romer Geocadin and the Education Innovation Committee (Dr. Megan Richie is now at the helm), the ANA launched a new learning management system, a podcast, a webinars program, and a bite-size video course collection. While the podcast has really taken off, the ANA Highlights bite-size learning program is catching fire. Dr. Michelle Johansen has been working over the last year to launch the ANA Highlights Statistical Snapshots program and is guiding efforts on the ANA Highlights Neurogenetics course chaired by Dr. M. Elizabeth Ross. The ANA's OnDEC (short for education on-demand) platform is a one-stop shop for ANA members. All ANA CME is provisioned from this system allowing us to create transcripts for members of all CME they have earned through the ANA.

Q. Can I get CME for listening to a podcast?

Jen: Yes! Each year we bundle all the possible credits for listening to each episode into a single CME offering - this allows members to complete one short CME evaluation to claim the maximum amount of credits for listening to the podcast over the course of the year. The CME "opens" after the annual meeting and members can

claim credit up until January 31 for the prior year's season (12 months of content).

Q. If I attend the ANA Annual Meeting, how and when do I get CME for it?

Jen: I'll let you in on a little secret... ANA OnDEC is open for CME for the meeting on the last day of the meeting. While most folks wait to get the email to let them know they can claim CME, we do have a handful of folks who are onto this secret - it is convenient to complete that short evaluation while the information from the meeting is still fresh and perhaps from the plane on the way home.

Q. I would like to offer a course at my institution and provide CME credits, can the ANA help me with that?

Jen: Absolutely. The ACCME allows CME providers to work with non-accredited organizations (some rules apply) in what is called a joint providership. If you are interested, please <u>email me</u> or <u>Carole Bernstein</u>.

Did you know the ANA offers more than 25 online CME offerings at any given time? Your colleagues on the ANA Education Innovation Committee have been busy this last year creating ANA member-specific online CME courses. Navigate over to the <u>ANA OnDEC catalog.</u>


The primary goals of this competitive grant are to:


ANA HIGHLIGHTS STATISTICAL SNAPSHOTS
