


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



IN MEMORY OF DR. KENNETH HEILMAN

Kenneth M. Heilman, M.D., a founder of the field of behavioral neurology who impacted generations of young neurologists worldwide and served the <u>University of Florida</u> <u>College of Medicine</u> for over 50 years, died July 15. He was 86. Dr. Heilman was a longtime member of the ANA.

The <u>Helping to End Addiction Long-term® Initiative</u> funds research to develop and test non-addictive treatments for pain as part of the overall HEAL effort to combat the opioid crisis in America. The NIH is now embarking upon a strategic plan to guide HEAL's future investment in pain and opioid use disorder research.

You may contribute to a <u>Request for Information (RFI)</u> released by the NIH HEAL Initiative® seeking input for this strategic planning effort. As a diverse community of physician-scientists pushing the limits of neuroscience research to combat disease and bring novel treatments to people worldwide, you can provide your expertise and invaluable perspectives on priorities for future HEAL pain research. Please send your feedback by **July 31, 2024**.

The NIH is seeking input on:

- Research addressing unmet needs in pain management
- Research on opioid use disorder and overdose not already captured in <u>NIDA's</u> <u>strategic plan</u>
- Cross-cutting research at the intersection of opioid use disorder/overdose and pain management

Additional areas of interest for HEAL-supported pain research include:

- Developing non-addictive pain therapeutics
- Identifying pain biomarkers and predictors
- Optimizing existing and novel interventions to prevent transition from acute to chronic pain, improve severe pain management, and reduce the risk of addiction
- Informing pathways to pain care, implementation, and health services across the lifespan


