ANA INVESTIGATES MINIMALLY INVASIVE NEUROSURGERIES FOR SPONTANEOUS INTRACEREBRAL HEMORRHAGE

Stay tuned next week when the ANA will release the June <u>ANA Investigates</u> episode on Minimally Invasive Neurosurgeries for Spontaneous Intracerebral Hemorrhage. The recently published ENRICH trial is the first to show that minimally invasive neurosurgery may improve functional outcomes for patients with hemorrhagic stroke. The study's lead author Dr. Gustavo Pradilla will talk about the differences between ENRICH and previous negative trials, and future neurosurgical approaches for spontaneous intracerebral hemorrhage. This podcast should be available on June 25.
