We recognize <u>Jeffrey Henderson, MD, MPH</u>, a Lakota and a member of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe. After completing his Master of Public Health at the University of Washington in 1999, he moved back to western South Dakota to work on addressing underlying determinants of health in Native American Communities there. Dr. Henderson founded and directs the Black Hills Center for American Indian Health. He has championed scientific research and provided mentorship for American Indian and Alaska Native Investigators. The center leads community efforts that have successfully reduced smoking, better identified cancer risks, addressed environmental disparities, and promoted traditional Lakota healing.



Another way in which the ANA recognizes outstanding contributors to neurology and neuroscience is through the ANA Awards Program, which will send out the call for nominations in December 2024.
